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2022 End of Year Competition

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Updates & Important Info

Prints are BACK!	Yes, Virginia – there is a Print Competition this year! As stated in our Image Evaluation Procedures, you may convert any image submitted as a digital image into a print for the EOY Competition. Look for a message from the Print Director for a time and place to deliver your prints. <i>(They may be accepted at the October meeting.)</i>
Post-Processing Update	Because of the many new software options and upgrades, we have altered our requirements to allow you to make enhancements to exposure, color and tone, sharpening, contrast, cropping, cloning, minor retouching, and rotation for photos entered in all of the General Categories . These images must NOT contain elements from multiple photos and the final result should retain a realistic feel. Please enter your more creative efforts (combining multiple images, adding elements from other photos, substantial artistic enhancements, etc.) into the Assigned Subject or Creative Art Categories where the sky is the limit for edits.
Deadline for Image Submission	You must submit properly formatted and sized digital images (jpg files) for EACH image you wish to enter. Yes – we need a digital image for each print, also. These digital images are due by our EOY Deadline: Midnight, October 15, 2022. Email them to our Digital Director: Digital.CCRVA@gmail.com .
Permissions	By entering this Competition, you agree to allow the publication/display of your images on the CCR website , facebook page , and in our monthly publication, “Southern Exposure” .
Digital File Naming	The general guidelines for file naming remain the same. Please reference the Digital File Naming section for the updated Assigned Subject abbreviations.
Group Designations	We have THREE Groups in which you may choose to compete. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Novice/Intermediate Group (Group N) • Advanced Group (Group A) • Expert Group (Group E) Please carefully assess where your photography skills rank as you determine at which level you should compete. You may move to a higher Group at any time. If you wish to move back to a lower Group, you must request and be approved by the CCR Board.
EOY Judging	End of Year Competition judging will take place on November 12, 2022.
EOY Awards Presentation & Banquet	Plans are underway for a return to our Annual Banquet this year where winners will be announced. Please note: The event will be held on Wednesday, December 7, 2022. This is the FIRST Wednesday in December. Winners will receive official certificates acknowledging their achievements. Memorial (Best) Awards will receive trophies.



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<p>Points & Scores</p>	<p>As in the past, three top photography experts assign numerical ratings of up to 9 Points to each image, for a maximum Score of 27 Points.</p> <p>The Scores (Total Points) for each image are then used to rank the entries in each Judging Block (Category, Color Designation, Media Type, and Group) from highest to lowest to determine 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Places, as well as Honorable Mentions. Any resulting ties within the Judging Blocks are immediately decided by the Judges in additional rounds of judging.</p>
<p>Minimum Total Score</p>	<p>Utilizing the Judges' Scores, the EOY Team will apply a Minimum Total Score (MTS) threshold, so ALL qualifying images are recognized within their respective Judging Block (Category, Color Designation, Media Type, and Group). The Novice/Intermediate Group's Score threshold is lower than the Advanced Group's, and the Expert Group has the highest Score requirement.</p> <p>As Judges – and therefore Scores - vary from year-to-year, final MTSs for each Group will be determined by the Board after the judging so that approximately 20-25 % of the images will receive Awards.</p> <p>The number of Awards within a Judging Block is determined by how many photographs meet these <i>qualifications</i> – NOT by how many photos are <i>entered</i> (as in the past). If no entries within a Category reach the Minimum Total Score threshold, then no Awards will be given.</p>
<p>Credits</p>	<p>Beginning in 2021, Members began accumulating Credits based on the number of Awards won. These Credits will be accumulated over no more than a running 3-year timeframe.</p> <p>Credit Amounts:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 1st Place = 3 Credits • 2nd Place = 2 Credits • 3rd Place = 1 Credit • Honorable Mention = 0 Credits • Major Awards = 0 Credits
<p>Group Advancement</p>	<p>Members will advance to a higher Group based on the Credits accumulated over a running 3-year timeframe.</p> <p>Advancement Criteria</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Novice/Intermediate Group advances at 25 or more total Credits • Advanced Group advances at 30 or more total Credits <p>Once a photographer advances to a higher Group, s/he starts over with 0 Credits. ANY photographer may self-advance into a higher Group if s/he wishes. Once a photographer moves to a higher Group, s/he may only move downward by petitioning the CCR Board for approval.</p> <p>A Board Member may contact you to recommend a Group change based on the Credits you accumulated in prior EOY Competitions.</p>



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General Rules

1. Photographers submitting images for the EOY Competition must be Camera Club of Richmond Members in good standing, having paid the current year Membership Dues: \$40.
2. The Camera Club of Richmond's End of Year Competition allows each Member to enter up to **TWELVE** images in the contest and are subject to these rules:
 - Images that are submitted throughout the year into *[Image Evaluations](#) are called **Standard Images**, and you may enter **up to twelve**.
 - You may opt to **substitute** up to **FIVE** images that were **NOT previously** evaluated. These images are called **Wildcards**.
3. All submissions, camera work (including staging and post-production), as well as any "creative changes" must be the work of the photographer submitting the image.
4. Images made while under the **immediate direction or technical supervision** of another person are not eligible. (For example, **being given specific exposure and technical settings** by an instructor while attending a photo outing, seminar, class, trip, or safari are not eligible.)
5. An image may **only be entered once** into a single EOY Competition. (For instance, the image may not be entered as both a B&W and a Color image, or into different Categories.)
6. Images may NOT include the photographer's name on the face of the image.
7. Entries must be submitted with the proper Digital File Name and correct format.
8. You may also add a digital frame or mat to your submission to give it a "finished" presentation. See [Anthony Rumley's Video](#) on CCR's YouTube channel for instructions.
9. Post Processing Guidelines:
 - In the **General Categories** (Animals, Architecture, Flora, Landscape, Pictorial, and Portrait), images may be edited, however, post-processing **may be used only to enhance the existing image to ensure realism**. **Enhancements** are allowed to exposure, color and tone, sharpening, cloning, minor retouching, contrast, cropping, and rotation. You may NOT combine elements from multiple images.
 - The **Special Categories** (the 3 **Assigned Subjects** and **Creative Art**) are intended to show each photographer's creativity and skills to enhance an image. You may combine elements from multiple images and use unlimited post-processing, including filters and creative imaging software. Images in these Categories are judged on their imagination, creativity, uniqueness, and editing.

*The Camera Club of Richmond (CCR) offers six [Image Evaluations](#) to our Members each year. Members are invited to submit one or two images that are reviewed and critiqued by a seasoned/professional photographer during those designated monthly meetings.



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Category Names, Abbreviations, & Descriptions

Animals (AN)	Animal photography traditionally refers to images of undomesticated animal species that normally live in the wild. Animal Photography documents various forms of wildlife in a natural or simulated habitat. An example of simulated habitat would be an image of a captive animal in a zoo that does not show cages, buildings, or other manufactured construction not present in its natural surroundings. The incidental presence of animals (e.g., distant birds, cattle, etc.) or manufactured objects (e.g., distant fences, vehicles, etc.) is acceptable.
Architecture (A)	Architectural photography is the photographing of buildings and similar manufactured structures that are accurate representations of their subjects.
Creative Art (CA)	Creative Art is an extension of conventional photography and post-processing into creative art. Its purpose is to stimulate those creative thoughts and encourage experimentation with innovative ideas going beyond a simple photograph.
Flora (F)	Flora photography is a photograph of plant life occurring in a particular region or timeframe.
Landscape (L)	Landscape photography shows spaces within the world, sometimes vast and unending, but other times of a smaller scope. Landscape photographs typically capture the presence of nature (e.g., panoramic views of the Grand Canyon, or a Seascape) with a primary emphasis on the natural subjects. A Landscape can also focus on manufactured features or disturbances within the natural landscapes (e.g., Richmond Skyline from the Flood Wall, etc.)
Portrait (PO)	Portrait photography is a photograph of a person or group of people that captures the personality, traits, or features of the subject by the use of effective lighting, backdrops, poses, direction, or post-processing. Street Photographs meeting these criteria may also qualify as Portraits.
Pictorial (PI)	Pictorial photography is a general photography Category. It might be a still-life image, a casual picture of a person or pet (not a formal portrait), street photography, travel images, photojournalism, or any image not previously addressed in another Category. This would be the Category for pet photography, whether posed or just spontaneous.
Assigned Subjects (AS_P) (AS_A) (AS_T)	Any image previously submitted to a Monthly Image Evaluation as an Assigned Subject. The Assigned Subjects for 2022 are: Photojournalism or Street Photography Abandoned About Time

Submitted images that do not meet the requirements of the Category may be disqualified at the Judges' discretion.



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Color Designations

Images may be submitted as either **Color Images** or **Black and White Images**.

Color (C)	Color images are shot in full color or contain any color other than black & white.
Black & White (BW)	Black & White images are monochrome images, including infrared photographs, produced in black and white or in varying tones of only one color. Images that are primarily monochrome but contain added color to part of the image should be submitted as Color, NOT as B&W.

Color Designations are judged separately for each **Category, Media Type, and Group**.

Media Types

Images may be submitted as either **Digital Images** or **Prints**.

Digital Images (D)	Digital images must be submitted as .jpg files. Refer to these sections for additional instructions: <u>Resizing Images in Adobe Lightroom</u> <u>Resizing Images in Adobe Photoshop</u> See the <u>Digital Submission Rules</u> for specific guidelines on submitting digital images.
Prints (P)	Prints must be mounted, matted, or printed onto any material that allows the image to be freestanding in the light box. Refer to the <u>Print Submission Rules</u> for specific guidelines on preparing and submitting Prints.

Media Types are judged separately for each **Category, Color Designation, and Group**.



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Groups and Group Advancement

Groups

CCR has **THREE Groups** in which you may choose to compete:

Group Name	Description
Novice/Intermediate Group N	New CCR Members or Members who have not entered a prior EOY Competition who feel they are just beginning to learn photography skills.
Advanced Group A	Members who feel that they have advanced photography skills beyond the novice or intermediate level.
Expert Group E	Members who have well-developed photography skills, consistently placing 1 st , 2 nd , or 3 rd in prior EOY Competitions.

All new Members, and those who have never competed before in a [CCR EOY Competition](#), are invited to join and compete in the **Novice/Intermediate Group**. However, you may choose to jump into any **Group** you wish for your first Competition. Any Member may move to a higher **Group** at any time. However, if a Member wishes to move back to a lower **Group**, s/he must request and be approved by the CCR Board.

Groups are judged separately for each **Category, Color Designation, and Media Type**.

Group Advancement

Beginning in 2021, Members began accumulating Credits based on the number of Awards won.

Credit Amounts:

- 1st Place = 3 Credits
- 2nd Place = 2 Credits
- 3rd Place = 1 Credit
- Honorable Mention = 0 Credits
- Major Awards = 0 Credits

These **Credits** will be accumulated over no more than a running 3-year timeframe. When an individual's Credit Totals reach the benchmark amount, the Member graduates to the next **Group**.

Advancement Criteria

- Novice/Intermediate Group graduates at 25 or more total Credits
- Advanced Group graduates at 30 or more total Credits

Once a Member advances to a higher Group, s/he starts over with 0 Credits. ANY photographer may self-advance into a higher Group if s/he wishes. **Once a photographer moves to a higher Group, s/he may only move downward by petitioning the CCR Board for approval.**

As the EOY Team prepares for each Competition, a Member of that team may contact certain Members to recommend a Group change based on the Credits they have accumulated in prior EOY Competitions.



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Scoring & Minimum Total Scores

Scoring

As in the past, three top photography experts will assign **Points** to each image submitted. Points can range from **3 to 9 Points** for each image - for a maximum total of **27 Points** per image.

Those **Scores** are then used to rank the entries in each **Judging Block** from highest to lowest to determine 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Places, as well as Honorable Mentions. Any resulting ties within the Judging Blocks are immediately decided by the Judges via additional rounds of judging.

Minimum Total Score

In 2021, following the lead of several other photography associations and clubs, CCR changed the way we determine Awards for images submitted to our EOY Competition. Instead of assigning Awards based on the number of entries in each **Judging Block**, the CCR Board voted to refocus our emphasis on **merited images**, so that **all** meritorious images are recognized.

In our merit-based system, each **Group** is assigned a **Minimum Total Score (MTS)**. Those MTS levels will increase commensurate with Group skill levels (i.e., the Novice/ Intermediate MTS will be lower than Advanced; and Advanced will be lower than Expert.)

- **All** images meeting this MTS threshold for a **Judging Block (Category, Color Designation, Media Type, and Group)** will earn Awards.
- The Judges will immediately break any ties via additional rounds of judging.
- If all three of the highest scoring images meet the MTS, then 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Place Awards are given, regardless of how many images are entered.
- Any additional images meeting the MTS are awarded Honorable Mentions.
- Awards for **Assigned Subjects**:
 - All Groups are judged together in the each of the three Assigned Subject Categories.
 - 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Place Awards will be given.
 - Honorable Mentions will be awarded based on the MTS for each Group.

As Judges – and therefore Scores - vary from year-to-year, final MTSs for each Group will be determined by the CCR Board after the judging so that approximately 20-25% of the images will receive Awards.

Note: If no entries in a Judging Block (Category, Color Designation, Media Type, and Group) meet their MTS, then no Awards will be given.



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Credits

Beginning in 2021, Members began accumulating **Credits** based on the number of Awards won. These Credits will be accumulated over no more than a running 3-year timeframe. When an individual's Credit Total reaches the benchmark amount, they will graduate to the next Group.

Credit Amounts:

- 1st Place = 3 Credits
- 2nd Place = 2 Credits
- 3rd Place = 1 Credit
- Honorable Mention = 0 Credits
- Major Awards = 0 Credits



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Submission Criteria

Digital Submission Rules

The Digital Director needs digital files to organize the hundreds of images being judged. In addition, the CCR Webmaster will create a [Member Gallery](#) of all winning images on the CCR Website and images may be featured on the [CCR facebook page](#) and in our monthly publication, "[Southern Exposure](#)".

You must submit a properly formatted and sized digital images by the EOY deadline:
Midnight, October 15, 2022.

There are the two basic specifications:

- Digital images must be in jpg format.
- The longest side of your digital image must not exceed 1920 pixels.

Digital File Naming

Digital images must be properly named so that the hundreds of submissions can be more easily sorted and evaluated. Be sure to change your digital file name to follow this Naming Convention when submitting your digital images:

[Media Type]_[Category Abbreviation]_[Color Designation]_[Group]_[Title of Image]_[Standard or Wildcard]_[Your Name].jpg

OMIT the Brackets ([])

INCLUDE the Underscores (_)

INCLUDE any necessary Spaces or Dashes in Your Name and your Image Title.

Use only jpg file type.

For example, this file name:

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Digital File Delivery

All digital images must be emailed to the Digital Director by **MIDNIGHT, October 15, 2022**, at this address: Digital.CCRVA@gmail.com. Email your jpg files (2 or 3 at a time):

Subject: **EOY Competition**

Click the paperclip icon to **attach** your digital files. *Do not imbed photos in the body of your email.* You'll receive an automated confirmation from the Digital Director. If you have not received this confirmation by the next day, you should contact him/her to verify that your files were received.

Print Submission Rules

Prints are evaluated on a light box, according to [Photographic Society of America \(PSA\)](#) rules.

Prints must be at least 5" x 7" and no larger than 16" x 30" in size (including any mat).

Prints must be mounted, matted, or printed onto any material that allows the image to be freestanding in the light box.

Make sure that the method for adhering the printed image to the backing cannot be seen on the front of the image. (Please no scotch-taped corners.)

Framed prints are not allowed.

Attach a completed copy of the [EOY Print Form](#) to the upper-left corner of the back of the mat. Please ensure that all writing is legible.

Look for a message from the Print Director for a time and place to deliver your prints. *(They may be accepted at the October meeting if you have them ready by then.)*

Digital File Requirement for Prints

If you are submitting a print, you must also submit a properly formatted and sized digital image by the EOY deadline: **Midnight on the 3rd Saturday in October**. The Digital Director needs these digital files to organize the hundreds of images (prints and digital) being judged. S/He creates a list of all prints submitted, then forwards that, along with those image files to the Print Director. This helps the Print Director organize the prints for the Judges.

In addition, the CCR Webmaster will create a [Member Gallery](#) of all winning images on the CCR Website and we will highlight these winners on our [CCR facebook page](#).

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End of Year Awards

In 2021, following the lead of several other photography associations and clubs, CCR changed the way we determine **EOY Awards** for our images.

We are now putting the emphasis on Merited Images, so that **all** meritorious images are recognized; Instead of assigning Awards based on the *number of entries* in each **Judging Block** as we have done in the past, the CCR Board now assigns a **Minimum Total Score (MTS)** for each Group. Those MTS levels will increase commensurate with the skill levels (i.e., Novice/Intermediate MTS will be lower than Advanced; and Advanced will be lower than Expert.)

- **All** images meeting the MTS threshold for its **Judging Block** will earn Awards.
- The Judges will immediately decide any ties via additional rounds of judging.
- If all three of the highest scoring images meet the MTS, then 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Place Awards are given.
- Any additional images meeting the MTS will be awarded Honorable Mentions.
- Awards for **Assigned Subjects**:
 - All **Groups** are judged together in the three Assigned Subject Categories.
 - 1st, 2nd, & 3rd Place Awards are given to the three images with the highest **Point** scores.
 - Honorable Mentions will be awarded according to the MTS for each Group.

Winners of these EOY Awards will receive a lovely certificate (suitable for framing!) acknowledging this achievement.

Note: If no entries in a Judging Block meet the Minimum Total Score, no Awards will be given.

Memorial (Best) Awards

The EOY Judges will select six outstanding images for the Camera Club of Richmond's **Memorial (Best) Awards**. The winners of these Awards will receive trophies (to grace their bookshelves!)

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References, Support, & Helpful Hints

FROM A JUDGE’S POINT OF VIEW

1. Overall Impact/ Impression	Does the image tell a “story” and is the subject of the image appropriate to the story? Does the image evoke emotion? Does the image have a “wow” factor?
2. Technical Factors	Does the image display focus, depth of field, exposure, lighting, contrast, and color balance (or tonal scale in black and white images) that are appropriate to the subject matter and the “story” being told by the photographer?
3. Creativity	Is the photo original and fresh in composition and/or in the use of lighting, perspective, color, special effects, etc.?
4. Composition	Is the design of the image visually pleasing or disturbing depending on the intent of the photographer? Do the elements of the image hold the observer and easily draw him/her to its subject? Does the composition come together as a whole, providing balance or lack thereof as appropriate to subject matter and the “story”?
5. Finishing	If present, do physical or digital mats, borders, vignetting, etc. add to the photo or distract from it?

Remember that each Evaluator and Judge is expressing his or her own personal opinion and that “Beauty is in the eye of the Beholder” – AND the Photographer!



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HOW DO I SELECT A CATEGORY?

The selection of a **Category** for your award-winning image can be a daunting task. If you enjoy surfing the net there are numerous articles, statements, and self-proclaimed authorities who describe, define, and declare what is right and what is wrong. Nevertheless, this is time-consuming and confusing at best.

One method, used by pros and amateurs, is to ask yourself a few personal questions about your motive for capturing that image. For example, was your motive to:

- Shoot that elusive tiger on your African Safari? He would be in **Animals**.
- Document a historical cathedral? Then, it would fit into **Architecture**.
- Preserve the color and texture of a beautiful blossom? This would be **Flora**.
- Show the magnitude of a vast desert? This would be a **Landscape**.
- Tell a story or show an event? This would be **Pictorial**.
- Capture the beauty or emotion of a particular individual? This is a **Portrait**.
- Combine multiple images and/or demonstrate your post processing skills? This would be **Creative Art**.

If you answer your “motive” question honestly, you will probably select the correct Category.

Our six General Categories are:

- **Animals**
- **Architecture**
- **Flora**
- **Landscape**
- **Pictorial**
- **Portrait**

A seventh, Special Category exists to allow unlimited, creative post-processing edits:

- **Creative Art**

At the beginning of each year, the CCR Board announces three special Categories referred to as “**Assigned Subject**” Categories for that year. The intent is to challenge our Photographers to try something new or stretch their post processing skills (since these Categories also allow unlimited, creative post-processing edits). This year, those Categories are:

- **Photojournalism or Street Photography**
- **Abandoned**
- **About Time**



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GLOSSARY OF IMPORTANT TERMS

Assigned Subjects	At the beginning of each year, the CCR Board announces three special Categories referred to as Assigned Subject Categories for that year. The intent is to challenge our photographers to try something new or stretch their post processing skills (since these Categories allow unlimited post-processing creativity).
Black & White Images [BW]	The Color Designation BW refers to Black & White images. They are monochrome images, including infrared photographs, produced in black and white or in varying tones of only one color. Images that are primarily monochrome but contain added color to any part of the image should be submitted as Color, NOT as B&W.
Camera Club of Richmond Member	A CCR Member is one who has paid Membership Dues for the current year. All CCR Members are eligible to submit images for Image Evaluations (held during six times per year at monthly CCR Meetings) as well as participate in the End of Year Competition .
Camera Club of Richmond Dues	CCR dues for FULL Membership in the club are \$40. <i>Please note: Membership in CCR MeetUp (MeetUp.com/Camera-Club-of-Richmond) is free, however if you only belong to CCR MeetUp, you are NOT eligible to submit images for Image Evaluations or participate in the End of Year Competition.</i>
Categories	These are the general groups to which you will submit your images for the End of Year Competition . See the official Category list for guidance on where to place your photos or contact any CCR Board Member for help.
Color Designation	Color Designation refers to the range of colors contained in your image. Black & White (BW) images are monochrome images, including infrared photographs, produced in black and white or in varying tones of only one color. Images that are primarily monochrome but contain added color to part of the image should be submitted as Color, NOT as Black & White. Color (C) refers to images shot in full color or containing any color other than black and white.
Color Images [C]	The Color Designation Color refers to images shot in full color or containing any color other than black and white.



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<p>Credits</p>	<p>Beginning in 2021, CCR added a new dimension to our EOY Competition. The Awards earned are assigned Credits:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 1st Place = 3 Credits • 2nd Place = 2 Credits • 3rd Place = 1 Credit • Honorable Mention = 0 Credits • Major Awards = 0 Credits (since they received 3 Credits for 1st Place) <p>Photographers will accumulate Credits to determine when they graduate to a higher Group. <u>Records are being kept beginning with the 2021 EOY Competition and will be cumulative within each Group for a running 3-year timeframe.</u></p> <p>Note: Credits earned as a “Novice/Intermediate” are used to determine when to move up to “Advanced.” Once there, you begin again with “0” and accumulate “Advanced Credits” to determine when you move to “Expert”.</p>
<p>End of Year Competition (EOY)</p>	<p>CCR holds a Competition at the end of each year and invites Members to submit up to twelve photographs to compete for Awards in several different Categories. Up to five of those photos may be Wildcard Images. The other images (called Standard Images) must have been evaluated at one of the monthly CCR Image Evaluations during the current year.</p> <p>These photos are due in October and judged by a panel of experienced photographers – usually from outside the Richmond area – in November. Awards are presented at our CCR Awards Presentation (and hopefully, a Banquet!) which is held in place of our regular CCR meeting on the first or second Wednesday in December (depending on venue availability).</p>
<p>EOY Groups</p> <p>[N]</p> <p>[A]</p> <p>[E]</p>	<p>CCR now offers THREE Groups in which our photographers will vie for Awards in our EOY Competition</p> <p><u>Novice/Intermediate – Group N</u></p> <p>This group is for new/novice CCR Members who feel they are just beginning to learn their photography skills.</p> <p><u>Advanced - Group A</u></p> <p>This Group is for Members who feel that they have advanced photography skills beyond the novice or intermediate level.</p> <p><u>Expert - Group E</u></p> <p>This Group is for Members who feel that they have “expert” photography skills, consistently placing 1st, 2nd, or 3rd in prior EOY Competitions.</p> <p>ANY photographer may self-select into a higher Group if s/he wishes.</p> <p>Once a photographer moves to a higher Group, s/he may only move downward by petitioning and being approved by the CCR Board.</p>



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<u>Image Evaluations</u>	Six times a year, CCR holds an Image Evaluation during our regular Monthly Meeting. CCR Members (who have paid their Annual Dues) are invited to submit 1 or 2 images for review. We invite a professional/experienced photographer or local artist to review these images and provide constructive feedback to help us learn and improve as photographers.
JPG	JPG stands for Joint Photographic Experts Group. JPG is the standard file format for compressing digital images so they can be stored or sent by email more easily. CCR requires that all images submitted for Image Evaluations and End of Year Competition are in the <u>JPG file format</u> (extension “.jpg”).
JPEG	Please do NOT use the “JPEG” file extension on your digital files. Please DO use the “.jpg” extension.
Judging Block	A Judging Block is just a convenient way to label the collective images that are competing with each other. It is the block of images that are judged together as determined by Category, Color Designation, Media Type, and Group. For instance: Color, Prints in the Animal Category , for the Expert Group are judged separately from the B&W, Prints in the Animal Category , for the Expert Group. Thus, separate Judging Blocks will be created for <u>every</u> combination of the four factors listed above.
<u>Media Type</u> [D] (P)	Media Type indicates whether the image is entered as a: Digital Image, or a Print. Detailed submission requirements are in the: <u>Digital Submission Rules.</u>
Minimum Total Score (MTS)	In 2021, following the lead of several other photography associations and clubs, CCR changed the way we determine Awards for images submitted to our EOY Competition. Instead of assigning Awards based on the number of entries in each Category, the CCR Board voted to refocus our emphasis on <i>merited images</i> , so that <u>all</u> meritorious images are recognized. Each Group is assigned a Minimum Total Score (MTS) . Those MTS levels will increase commensurate with the skill levels (i.e., Novice/ Intermediate MTS will be lower than Advanced; and Advanced will be lower than Expert.) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>All</u> images meeting this MTS threshold for a Judging Block (Category, Color Designation, Media Type, and Group) will earn Awards. • The Judges will immediately break any ties via additional rounds of judging.



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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If all three of the highest scoring images meet the MTS, then 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place Awards are given, regardless of how many images are entered. • Any additional images meeting the MTS will earn Honorable Mentions. • Awards for Assigned Subjects: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ All Groups are judged together in the Assigned Subject Categories. ○ 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Place Awards will be given. ○ Honorable Mentions are awarded based on the MTS for each Group. <p>As Judges – and therefore Scores - vary from year-to-year, final MTSS for each Group will be determined by the CCR Board after the judging so that approximately 20-25% of the images will receive Awards.</p> <p>Note: If no entries in a Category/Color Designation/Group meet their MTS, then no Awards will be given.</p>
<p>Naming Convention for EOY Competition</p>	<p>There is a specific way that images must be named for the EOY Competition, so that the hundreds of submissions can be more easily sorted and judged. You must change your digital file name to follow this Naming Convention when submitting your digital images:</p> <p>[Media Type]_[Category Abbreviation]_[Color Designation]_[Group]_[Title of Image]_[Standard or Wildcard]_[Your Name].jpg</p> <p><u>OMIT</u> the Brackets ([])</p> <p><u>INCLUDE</u> the Underscores (_)</p> <p><u>INCLUDE</u> any necessary Spaces or Dashes in Your Name and your Image Title.</p> <p>Use only <u>jpg</u> file type.</p> <p>For example, this file name:</p> <p style="text-align: center;">D_AS_T_BW_A_Time-Sensitive_ST_Karen Davis.jpg</p> <p style="text-align: center;">would represent a [D]igital Image [AS_T] Assigned Subject: About Time Category [BW] Black & White Image Group [A] Entitled: Time-Sensitive [ST] Standard Image (Previously submitted to an Image Evaluation) By Photographer: Karen Davis</p>
<p>Standard Images [ST]</p>	<p>Standard Images are those images that were submitted for Image Evaluations during the current year.</p> <p>Assigned Subject images must be submitted for an Evaluation in the current year; thus, they are ALWAYS considered Standard Images.</p> <p>You may submit up to 12 Standard Images for the EOY Competition.</p>



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Points & Scores	<p>Three top photography experts assign scores of up to 9 Points to each image, for a maximum Score of 27 Points.</p> <p>The Scores (Total Points) for each image are then used to rank the entries in each Judging Block from highest to lowest to determine 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Places, as well as Honorable Mentions. Any resulting ties within the Judging Blocks are immediately decided by the Judges in additional rounds of judging.</p>
Wildcard Images [WC]	<p>Wildcard Images are those images that were NOT submitted for an Image Evaluation during the current year.</p> <p>FIVE of the images you submit for the EOY Competition may be Wildcards.</p> <p>For an Assigned Subject to be submitted for the EOY Competition, it MUST have been previously submitted for an Image Evaluation during the current year. In other words, there can be <u>no Wildcard submissions into Assigned Subjects.</u></p> <p>And yes – you may submit just the five Wildcard images if you wish. There is no requirement to submit Standard Images at all.</p>

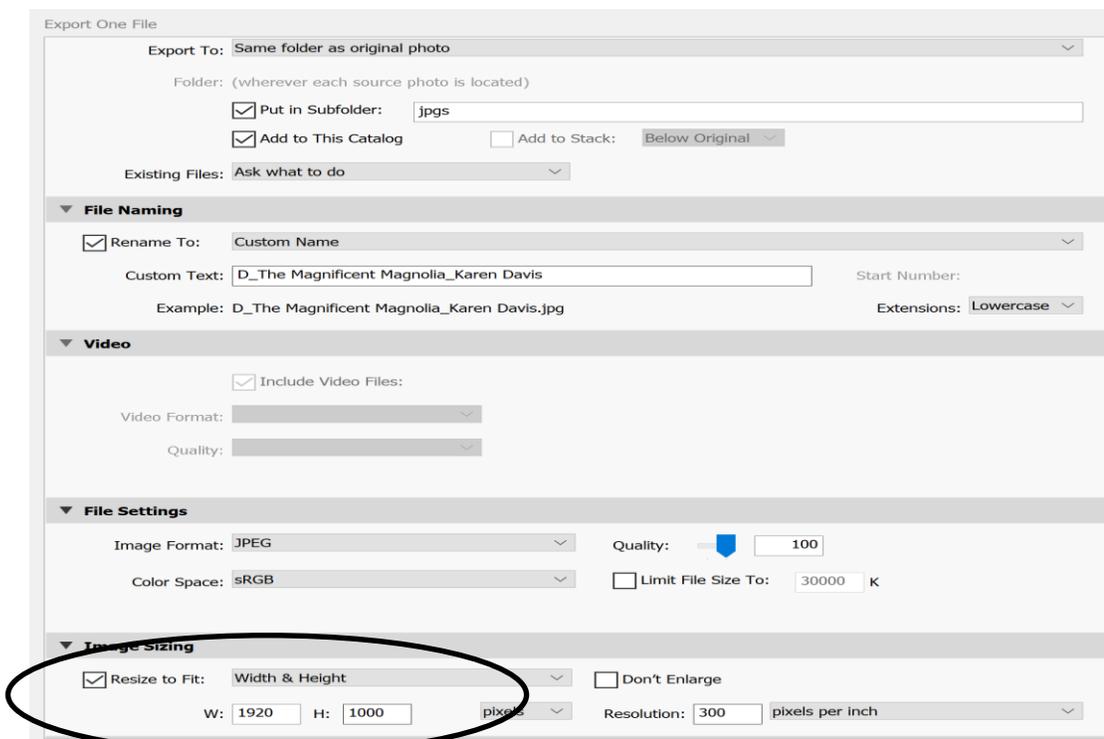

Why do I need to resize my images?

CCR Accepts digital images for the following:

All images submitted for any of the above must be as close to and cannot exceed 1920 pixels on the longest side of that image and should be under 1 MB (1000K) in size.

Before resizing your image, be sure ALL IMAGE EDITING IS COMPLETE and you are ready to submit your image for Evaluation/Competition.

How do I resize my images in Adobe Photoshop?

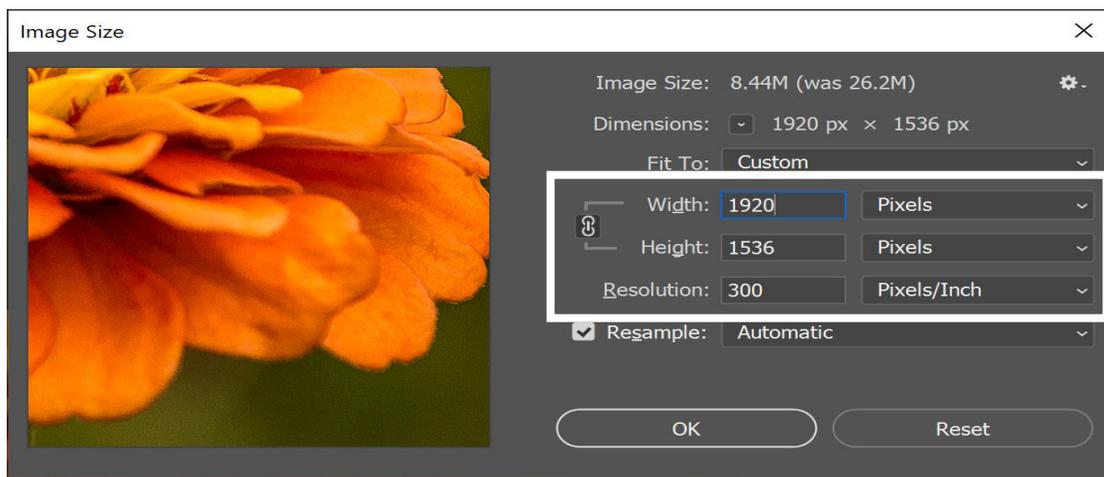
Open Photoshop.

Select **File** and choose the image you want to resize.

Select **Open** and your image will appear.

Select **Image > Image Size**.

You will see this menu:



Adjust the Pixel Dimensions to 1920 Pixels for the longest side:

- Width for a Horizontal Image
- Height for a Vertical Image

The other dimension is calculated automatically.

Resolution: Use the default.



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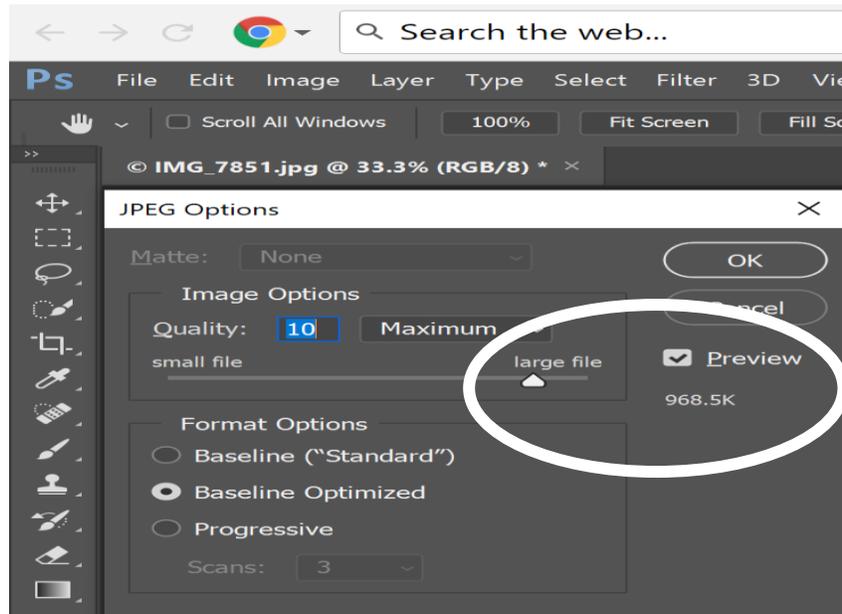
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Click **OK**.

Your image may appear smaller on your screen.

Select **File > Save As** and name your file into the proper [Naming Convention](#).

You will then see this window:



Click **OK**.

Your image will save to the folder you specified on your hard drive and is now ready to email to the Digital Director: Digital.CCRVA@gmail.com.

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FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS – AND ANSWERS!

My Question:	The Answer:
Who can enter the End of Year (EOY) Competition?	Current, paid Camera Club of Richmond (CCR) Members may enter. Dues are \$40 per year.
Are there any restrictions on the photos I enter?	Yes. Refer to the previously stated General Rules .
How many photos may I enter?	You may enter up to twelve (12) images. You are allowed up to FIVE (5) images that have not been previously evaluated this year (known as Wildcard s). Any other images (referred to as Standard Images) must have been critiqued at one of the monthly CCR Image Evaluation meetings.
What is a Wildcard Image?	Wildcards are images that have NOT been evaluated at one of the current year's Image Evaluations . Up to five of the images you submit may be Wildcard images.
May I submit prints as well as digital images?	Yes , you may enter any combination of prints and digital images up to the twelve images allowed.
What if I did not participate in the monthly Image Evaluations; can I still enter the EOY Competition?	Yes. Since you did not enter any previously evaluated (i.e., Standard) images, you may still enter up to five images as Wildcards . The reason for the rule is to encourage everyone to submit images during the year to learn from the preliminary Image Evaluations.
Do we differentiate images between Color and Black & White ?	Yes. You will enter your images into either the Color or Black & White Color Designation .
Who determines the Category in which my images are judged?	Each photographer assigns a Category to each of his/her photos based on the Category descriptions. If you are unsure which Category to select, please consult with one of the CCR Board Members for advice. If the Judges determine that an image does not meet the criteria for its Category, it may be disqualified.
What happens if I select the “wrong” Category ?	If the Judges determine that an image does not meet the criteria for its Category, it may be disqualified. To avoid this, if you are unsure which Category to select, please consult with one of the CCR Board Members for advice before submitting your images.



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My Question:	The Answer:
May I enter more than one image in a Category?	Yes. There is no restriction on putting multiple images into a single Category. You could put all twelve images into the same Category if you so choose.
May I enter one image into multiple Categories or Color Designations?	No. An image should be submitted only one time. You may not submit the same image into two different Categories nor as both B&W and Color.
May I change the title of my Standard Image ?	No. The title of a Standard Image must be exactly the same title used in the Image Evaluation.
Is there any exception to the titling rule?	Yes, there is one exception: An image title may be changed if the Evaluator specifically suggested a name change. If you choose to make this change, you MUST notify the Digital Director with the old and new titles.
What are the rules relating to Assigned Subjects ?	Images submitted in an Assigned Subject Category, must have been submitted in that Assigned Subject Category at the Image Evaluation for that subject. There are no post-processing restrictions on Assigned Subject images, so BE CREATIVE!
May I enter a Wildcard into an Assigned Subject Category ?	No. A Wildcard will not be accepted for any of the Assigned Subject Categories. All Assigned Subject images MUST have been submitted to the Evaluation for that Assigned Subject (thus they must be named as “ Standard ” images.)
May I incorporate adjustments suggested by an Evaluator into the final image submitted for EOY Competition ?	Yes. Minor adjustments suggested by the Evaluator are permitted. The revised image must originate from the same source file.
May I add a digital frame to my jpg for EOY Competition ?	Yes. If you wish to add a digital frame to your image for the EOY Competition, this is allowed. Check out our YouTube video by Anthony Rumley for instructions.
What other adjustments may I make to my images?	Images in the six “General” Categories may be enhanced, but these manipulations must be kept to a minimum and used only to enhance the existing image and ensure realism, such as with: levels, exposure, tonal changes, sharpening, cloning (for minor retouching). You are free to make any adjustments to images submitted in the “Creative Art” and “Assigned Subject” Categories.



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My Question:	The Answer:
May I re-submit an image that has been submitted in a prior, CCR EOY Competition?	Yes. You may re-submit an image if the image did not win any Awards in a prior, CCR EOY Competition.
When is the Submission Deadline for the digital version of ALL images?	The EOY Deadline for ALL digital images is <u>Midnight, October 15, 2022.</u>
What are Credits ?	<p>Awards earned in the EOY Competition are assigned "Credits":</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 1st Place = 3 Credits • 2nd Place = 2 Credits • 3rd Place = 1 Credit • Honorable Mention = 0 Credits • Major Awards = 0 Credits (since they have already received 3 Credits for earning 1st Place) <p>Photographers will accumulate "Credits" to determine when they will graduate to a higher Group.</p> <p>Records are kept beginning with the 2021 EOY Competition and are cumulative within each Group for a running 3-year timeframe.</p> <p>Credits earned as a "Novice/Intermediate" are used to determine when to move to "Advanced." Once there, you begin again with "0" and accumulate "Advanced Credits" to determine when you move to "Expert".</p>
What is Minimum Total Score (MTS) ?	<p>The Minimum Total Score (MTS) is the point threshold you must achieve to earn an EOY Award.</p> <p>The Novice/Intermediate Group's score threshold is lower than the Advanced Group's, and the Expert Group has the highest score requirement.</p> <p>Utilizing the Judges' scores, the EOY Team applies these Minimum Total Score thresholds, so that ALL qualifying images that score this number of Points and above are recognized within each Judging Block.</p> <p>As Judges – and therefore scores - vary from year-to-year, final MTSs for each Group will be determined by the CCR Board after the judging so that approximately 20-25% of the images will receive Awards.</p> <p>If no entries within a Category reach the Minimum Total Score threshold, then no Awards will be given.</p>
