## Assigned Subjects in 2017

*Assigned subjects was introduced to help members think outside the box. Following are the chosen topics for 2017. Dates will be chosen during the January board meeting.*

- **Wabi Sabi**

"Is the Japanese art of finding beauty in imperfection and profundity in nature, of accepting the natural cycle of growth, decay and death. It celebrates cracks, crevices and all the other marks of time, weather, and loving use behind."

Wabi refers to harmony, peace, tranquility and balance.

Sabi by itself means "the bloom of time," sabi things carry the burden of time, such as weathered wood, rusted cars, an abandoned barn collapsed onto itself.

- **Natural framed images**

"A natural frame is created when you place a secondary object such as a tree or a door in the scene of the photograph so that it frames your main subject."

- **Alphabet photography (Hidden Letters)**

Finding letters in ordinary things, a chain link looks like an "S" or a horseshoe looks like a "U." It could be that a shadow looks like a "W" or you could design a photograph with different letters in advertisement signs that complete a word.

## Rules for Evaluations

*Evaluations of member images are an integral part of club membership. Here are the rules for submissions:*

### GENERAL RULES

1. Members may enter a maximum of two images on evaluation nights. On Assigned Subject evaluation nights, only 1 image may be submitted in addition to the assigned subject. Images may be submitted as prints or digitals.
2. An image may be re-submitted for evaluation if it has never won an award in the Camera Club of Richmond's end of year competition.
3. All camera work, minor adjustments, and "creative" changes must be the work of the photographer.
4. Properly named and sized digital images of **ALL** entries (digital renditions of prints included) must be received no later than midnight on the Saturday just prior to the evaluation to be considered for that evaluation. No exceptions will be allowed.
5. Digital images submitted should be sized so that the longer side does not exceed 1920 pixels. Please use a resolution close to 72 to keep file size small to help with download time.
6. Digital images must be in jpeg format.
7. Digital images should be named using the format "[Image Title] - [Photographer's Name]" (i.e. Tulip Garden - Jane Doe). To identify a submission as an Assigned Subject image, add "-AS" after your name, i.e., Tulip Garden - Jane Doe – AS.

### DIGITAL SUBMISSIONS

In addition to the general rules above, digital images must be emailed to [digital@cameraclubofrichmond.com](mailto:digital@cameraclubofrichmond.com). Please include the word "digital" in the subject line. If you have not received emailed confirmation of receipt from the Digital Director by the day before the evaluation, you may wish to contact the Digital Director for verification.

### PRINT SUBMISSIONS

1. Prints will be evaluated on a light box, according to PSA rules.
2. Prints must be mounted, matted, or printed onto any material that allows the image to be freestanding in the light box.
3. Prints must be 5 x 7 or larger. Freestanding prints must not exceed 16x30 inches in size.
4. Framed prints are not allowed.

5. The photographer's name must not appear on the front of a submitted print.
6. The method for mounting or adhering the printed image so it is freestanding should not be seen on the front of the image. (Please no scotch taped corners.)
7. Email a properly named and sized digital image (Please refer to 4 - 7 of the General Rules above) of each print you are submitting to the Print Director at [prints@cameraclubofrichmond.com](mailto:prints@cameraclubofrichmond.com) no later than midnight on the Saturday just prior to the evaluation. (This is to allow a digital projection of each print to be displayed at evaluation so that all members may view the print while it is being critiqued by the evaluator.) If email is not available to you, please call the print director with the information.
8. When sending the digital copy, please include the word "PRINT" in the subject line.
9. Prints being submitted for evaluation should be delivered to the Print Director at the evaluation meeting no later than 6:45 p.m.
10. If a submitting member gives a print entry to another member to deliver due to his or her absence from an evaluation meeting and the entry is not delivered as intended, the submitting member, upon notifying the Print Director prior to the next regular evaluation, may, if approved by the Print Director, enter the undelivered image(s) as a makeup entry at the next regular evaluation.
